

POLICY COMMITTEE MEETING MINUTES
March 11, 2015

Call to Order:

The meeting was called to order at 7:36 PM by Chairman Hammond.

Present:, Jack Abernathy, Paul Hammond, Gary Peppin, Manager Michael Hart.
Also present: Chief Don Harris, Clerk Andrea Schroeder, DPW Superintendent Ed Brown.

Approval of the Agenda

It was moved by Councilman Peppin and seconded by Councilman Abernathy to approve the Agenda as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

Citizen Comments

None.

Department Head Presentations on Snow Removal on State and Flint Streets

Presentation by Clerk Schroeder

Clerk Schroeder made comments in regards to the following:

The cost to the City of Davison

Number of DPW workers

Past Upset tax payers:

- > Unfair to everyone not located on those two streets.
- > Everyone pays taxes and preferential treatment should not be given.
- > Business owners and landlords are benefitting - They make \$ and should be able to afford and maintain sidewalks and property.
- > Council members must be friends of the business owners and landlords.
- > Different standards based on your location in the City of Davison.
- > What about those that pay to have their sidewalks maintained due to age, ailments, etc.?

Past Expectations:

- > Salting for ice build-up.
- > Maintenance and repairs expected year-around at no additional charge.
- > City taking full responsibility for sidewalk on those two streets.
- > What if City can't meet the allotted time per the ordinance?
- > What really is the criteria?
- > Complaints that sidewalks weren't cleared quick enough or often enough.

Liability to the City of Davison:

- > Email response from our Liability and Property Pool Insurance carrier, Meadowbrook.

Currently:

- > The City of Davison staff have received no phone calls or complaints in regards to sidewalks not being cleared or pedestrians walking in the streets.
- > A local church called the City and offered services to anyone that needed help.
- > Code enforcement is working.

In the past the clearing of these sidewalks was not a positive environment. The years the City cleared the sidewalks was not determined. Also, the year the City discontinued the service was approximated at 2002.

The following are the notes made by the Recording Secretary and the Chairman during Clerk Schroeder's presentation.

Clerk Schroeder recounted some of the complaints from citizens when Flint and State street sidewalks were previously plowed by the City:

- They are not doing mine.
- The City is catering to money and landlords.
- Maintenance is wanted year round.
- The snow is not cleared quickly enough.
- Private persons are paying for the clearing of their sidewalks but property owners on State and Flint streets are not.
- There should be a business fee on the tax rate for snow clearing on Flint and State street sidewalks.

Clerk Schroeder continued:

- There have been no complaints this winter from owners on Flint and State streets about sidewalks being covered by City plowing.
- There is a possibility that liability insurance rates from the MML would increase if these sidewalks were plowed by the City.
- Question was raised of what other municipalities plow the sidewalks?
- The plowing of Flint and State street sidewalks was not a positive environment. The years of the previous plowing of Flint and State street sidewalks was not determined. It was believed it ended in 2002.

Presentation by Chief Harris

- There have been no complaints this winter of snow not being removed.
- There is a police report if someone slips and falls if the police are called.

- There have been increased instances of residents of Lockwood walking in the streets this winter.
- There have been no complaints of persons walking in the streets.

Presentation by Superintendent Brown

- Main point: Reacting to the requests of a few does not benefit the whole.
- Is there increased liability because of the sidewalk plowing of Flint and State streets?
- There is extra work with sidewalk snow removal.
- May not be enough staff to plow the sidewalks.
- May have to consider a contractor.
- Last winter there were 48 complaints on Flint and State streets that the DPW addressed.
- This winter there have been 29 complaints on Flint and State streets that the DPW has addressed.
- This is not an issue that needs to be changed.
- The sidewalk ordinance should not be changed.
- Question was raised of how to pay for the plowing, Special Assessment, increased taxes?
- How to pay for the snow removal is a problem. Will it be fair? We should not be reacting to a small problem.
- The proposal creates more problems.
- There will be the need for additional equipment.
- There is a program of volunteers to shovel sidewalks for those who are not able if the resident contacts the City.
- A contractor has been contacted. He wants a lump sum up front and no liability.
- The snow plowing of Flint and State by the City does not need to be addressed. There is no problem.
- Sidewalk snow removal on school sidewalks needs to be addressed with the school.
- Do not change anything.

Old Business

Preparation of Council Presentation of Sidewalks:

Councilman Abernathy presented a paper he had prepared on "Needs, Desires, And Expenditures: Must Prioritize." The main points are:

Expenditures:

1. Leaf Pick-up Curbside -----	\$30,000.00
2. Plowing of M15 & Flint Sts. -----	\$30,000.00

6. Inflow & Infiltration (no budget for income - either general fund and/or streets) -----	\$1,000,000.00
	<u>\$40,065,000.00</u>

Discussion

Item 1.

It was mentioned that the \$30,000 cost of fall curbside leaf-pickup would be about \$20 per parcel. This could be accommodated by a garbage fee increase from \$156 to \$175. It would be reviewed annually.

Item 3 and 5.

The street improvement program is being addressed by Manager Hart and Treasurer Pray. One of the things being considered is a bond program which would include the City portion of \$165,000 for Rising, Clark, and Dayton streets of which the state will provide \$825,000. Another item being considered is a capital improvement millage which would also include the \$165,000 for Rising, Clark and Dayton streets.

Item 4.

This item could possibly be financed by a special assessment.

Item 6.

Inflow and infiltration is very important and is a major project still in front of the City.

Snow Removal on Flint and State Streets

The presentations of the staff were discussed as well as Item 2 from Councilman's Abernathy's presentation. It was discussed that the snow plowing of Flint and State street sidewalks would treat the property owners differently on these streets than the rest of the City. During the discussion there was some question of what Council had voted on in the Monday, 3/9, Council meeting. The Chairman read the Policy Committee recommendation that Council had passed:

The Policy Committee and Manager Hart develop a plan for the plowing of the sidewalks on State Street and Flint Street and how to organize this activity as soon as practical through revision of the Sidewalk ordinance.

After considerable discussion, it was decided by consensus that a key issue and the first thing that should be settled is the liability question. In that regard, it was moved by Councilman Peppin and seconded by Councilman Abernathy:

To obtain a legal opinion from Corporate Counsel regarding liability of plowing of the sidewalks on State and Flint streets, and a letter from Risk Management also in regards to liability of the City plowing State and Flint street sidewalks.

The motion carried unanimously.

New Business

There was no new business.

Approval of Minutes

It was moved by Councilman Peppin and seconded by Chairman Hammond to approve the February 25, 2015 Minutes as presented. The motion carried unanimously. Signed minutes to be forwarded to Clerk Schroeder by Manager Hart.

I don't consider sidewalks to be the number one #1 priority.

I think streets are a higher priority than sidewalks.

We have control of our streets & sidewalks in the City.

We require that sidewalks be installed when a home is built. We have constructed sidewalks in the City, installed walking paths in the park(s) and along the streets in the city, but not all streets have sidewalks and an estimated cost to fill in the gaps is \$840,000.00 (see CIP proposal.) This does not include a maintenance program for the already existing sidewalks.

I think we have to prioritize what we can or cannot do. How do we finance \$40 million dollars worth of improvements in the City of Davison? The assessments and taxes or the millage rate will be so high that the residents cannot afford to live in Davison.

The City has a Sidewalk Ordinance that should be reviewed, but not repealed etc. on a whim. The word out on the street is to be a "walkable community," but can we afford this at this time?

We need to remember what the City has done to remain solvent. We have gone from 31 employees to 19, only paved Flint St. & Main St. In the past ten years.

Can we expect our residents to pay for special assessments, additional millages, etc. to do all these things at once?

1. Leaf Pick-up Curbside ----- \$30,000.00
(Contract it out to a company)
2. Street Improvement Program ----- \$38,000,000.00
3. Sidewalks (Fill in the Gaps) ----- \$840,000.00
4. Inflow & Infiltration ----- \$1,000,000.00

1 mill equals \$1.00 per \$1,000 of valuation.





BACKGROUND: The police department several times in the last number of years, have found themselves in need of a 4WD vehicle because of inclement weather and it being unsafe to travel in a normal police patrol vehicle. In fact, just within the prior month they had to borrow a 4WD truck from the DPW for safe transportation to patrol the city's streets and also had to transport a prisoner to the county the same night. We have checked with other police departments and they have in their fleets SUV or 4WD vehicles. Based upon our needs and creating an effective environment of public safety, it is important for us to add a 4WD Chevrolet Tahoe to the City's fleet of police patrol vehicles.

We requested a quote from Berger Chevrolet who was awarded the State Of Michigan MI Deal contract for Chevrolet and received a quote of \$ 32,210.00. After receiving the quote, we asked Hank Graff Chevrolet who has the (General Motors) patrol vehicle contract for Genesee County, if they could match the Mi-Deal price and they came back with \$32,205.00 for the same vehicle (see spec. attached). With the better price by \$5.00, rather than purchasing through the State Of Michigan MiDeal contract where we get the best price and competitive bidding, we have satisfied the City's purchasing requirements and were able to spend tax payer dollars with a City based business.

We have been informed by Hank Graff Chevrolet that the last date to order this vehicle at this price is April 8th 2015. If not ordered by then, we would have to wait until after August and can expect there to be a 3% -5% increase in the next model year pricing.

PROPOSED ACTION: Chief Harris would respectfully request permission to purchase a 2015 Chevrolet 4WD Tahoe Police Package at a cost of \$ 32,205.00 from Hank Graff Chevrolet of Davison, Michigan.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS: Partial funds were in the FY 2014/2015 budget, so we will be taking the existing funds from line item #661-932-985-000 of the equipment fund and will amend the budget for the remainder. The current available balance of the equipment fund is \$500,000.

MANAGER'S RECOMMENDATION: To order and purchase the above described vehicle from Hank Graff Chevrolet of Davison, Michigan. And, to have money allocated for adequately outfitting of the same vehicle.

RECOMMENDED MOTION: An action by City Council to authorize the City Manager to purchase a 2015 Chevrolet 4WD Tahoe Police Package from Hank Graff Chevrolet of Davison, Michigan for the amount of \$32,205 with an additional amount for outfitting the vehicle not to exceed \$7,000 (this includes factory deep tinted glass).
